

**Bible Study 3 – Renewing my service – Malachi 3:13 – 4:6**

What has beaten more politicians, defeated more sports teams, lost more wars, and closed more churches than anything else? Discouragement. It's opposite to "courage". When you discourage someone, you take away their courage or confidence. Discouragement happens when we get into a slump; and it can happen even in church work and Christian work and in the Christian life. In Malachi's day they were questioning if it was worth serving the Lord. They didn't see any benefit in doing what was right. They found out that it's not easy to serve God. Besides discouragement there was spiritual apathy.

<b>The context</b>	Malachi was probably the last prophet of the OT era. He followed the ministries of Haggai and Zechariah. He wrote to Jews living in Judah after the exile in Babylon. Although they had rebuilt the temple, their worship had degenerated into a lifeless formality and they no longer took the law seriously. And there were mixed marriages with pagans, unjust financial practices, withholding of tithes, and spiritual apathy.
